Air Rifle

As part of our desire to explore the different disciplines available at the club, we have asked Ian P to give a brief overview of the Air Rifle discipline...

Air Rifle target shooting is a popular discipline within the rifle target shooting community, offering opportunities to shoot from beginner up to Olympic level. The usual distance for shooting is 10m, with between 20 to 60 shots per round or competition.

Air rifle is shot from a free-standing position, without a sling. Typically, precharged pneumatic (PCP) rifles are used and are extremely accurate. The target sizes are the smallest of those used for any rifle discipline - the 10 is a ½mm dot, which the innermost part of the shot-hole must at least touch.

In terms of equipment, beginners are advised to start with a glove for the supporting hand and to supplement this with a shooting jacket (the club has a number available to borrow). For those keener to progress, shooting boots and trousers will be beneficial, together with a rifle stand.

The club has an excellent selection of PCP target air rifles available to members. If you wish to purchase your own, second hand target air rifles start at about ± 1000 but can be difficult to find due to the demand. A tin of 500 match pellets is approx. ± 12.50 .

The Club has an excellent track record in this discipline, being the most successful club in the National league since 2000. We have a eight lane air range, where instruction and coaching is available to those new to the discipline, as well as there being a wide range of competitions to suit all skill levels.

Safeguarding

A Gentle Reminder of the Club's Safeguarding Policy from our Child Protection Officer, Phil

We have a healthy cohort of 16 junior members shooting regularly at Surbiton. Everyone in the NSRA and its member clubs and organisations has a part to play in looking after the children with whom they are working. This is both a moral and a legal obligation. Surbiton Postal Rifle Club follows the policies and procedures provided by the NSRA in their guidance document - Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults in Target Shooting. We encourage everyone at the club to familiarise themselves with this guidance and will make sure there are printed copies for the noticeboard and desk.

While a lot of it may seem like common sense, there are excellent 'Dos' and 'Don'ts' summaries. We won't reproduce them all here but a few that may be more pertinent to our activities include:

- Do Set an example for others to follow
- Do Plan activities that involve more than one other person being present, or at least within sight and hearing of others.
- Do Follow the recommended adult to young person ratios for meeting and activities. Avoid being alone with young people. (i.e. Unless a parent or guardian, no adult member should be alone with an under 18 at any time)
- Don't' Take part in physical contact games with young people
- Don't Take part in inappropriate behaviour or contact (difficult when instructing use common sense and always ask permission if physical contact cannot be avoided emergencies notwithstanding!)

These may seem obvious, and we realise that they may add additional challenges to some activities – particularly for our coaches, but they are there to protect everybody and we do ask our members to follow them.
